We are devastated to announce the passing of one of our most active Sustainers, Mrs. Martha Vandervoort. Martha was an incredible lady that treated everyone with dignity. She was the Executive Director for Interfaith Ministries.

Martha joined the Anniston Calhoun Junior Service League in the 1988-1989 League year. She served as the Junior League Contact that year. From 1989 -1990, Martha served as President of the Junior Service League. It was during this time the Junior Service League began its metamorphosis into a Junior League when membership voted to pursue membership in the Association of Junior Leagues, Inc. In 1990-1991, Martha served as the Immediate Past President, a Junior League Contact, and on the Advisory Planning Commit-

tee. During this year, the League began the affiliation process with the Association of Junior Leagues International (AJLI) through a series of three informative visits. A Letter of Agreement was composed jointly by the Board and the AJLI representatives. Martha attended the AJLI Annual Conference in Toronto.

In the 1992-1993 League Year, the Junior Service League officially became the 279th Junior League of Anniston-Calhoun, Inc. Martha remained an active member until the end of the 1995-1996 League year and served on the Nominating Committee that year. 1996-1997 was Martha's first year as a Sustaining Member. Most people take a break then. Instead, Martha served on the Membership Development and Ways & Means Committees. After that year, she did take some time to be simply a Sustainer. In 1999-2000, however, she served as the Sustainer Representative on the Board of Directors. In 2000-2001, Martha received her first Sustainer of the Year award. In 2012-2013, she received her second.

Martha has been such an asset to our League. She was a Sustainer Representative when we revised our bylaws a few years ago. She attended events and was always willing to help us in any way she could. She was the one that advised us to attend AJLI conferences and that it was essential to invest in ourselves first so that we could better help the community. Martha took quite a few of us in as mentees. She had a way of making us feel welcome and capable of making important, lasting changes in our community. Her passing is a devastating loss for her family, friends, community, and League. We will miss her dearly.


