# New Member Project - Fill Closets For Fall



As part of the Junior League of Anniston Calhoun's Adopt-A-School partnership with Weaver Elementary School, this year's New Member class chose to focus on preparing children in need with clothing items for cold weather months. The Fill Closets for Fall campaign benefitted children in need at WES. Based on recommendations made by the school's principal and counselor, parents were able to sign

their child up to receive new or gently worn clothing items. These items included jackets, pants, long-sleeved tops, socks, hats, and other items.

The New Members held a donation drive during the month of October. Word of the drive spread through social media and television; the ladies appeared on Calhoun County's Most Wanted to promote the clothing drive and to help raise awareness of JLAC. The support from around the community was overwhelming. Not only did several local businesses partner with them to give discounts when clothing items were brought in, but dozens allowed the group to display flyers in their storefronts.

On Tuesday, November 3, the New Member class invited the families to come and pick up their prefilled bags of clothing items. Because of the overwhelming amount of clothes donated, the children were able to "shop" for additional clothing items. As an added treat for the parents, the New Member class provided a Chick-fil-A dinner.

"Being able to offer these families a free meal was icing on the cake," said New Member class president Jacki Lowry. "We often times take for granted running through a drive-thru to get a sandwich when we are hungry. For some of these children, Chick-fil-A was something they had only heard about before that night."

In all, 43 children from 19 families went home with full bags of clothes to help them combat the winter ahead. Chick-fil-A of Oxford was gracious to donate 25 sandwiches towards the project. The New Members purchased an additional 70 sandwiches, 95 fruit cups, and one bottle of water per family member.

# Ladies Who League - Member Spotlights

# Active Member—Katy Cairo



Katy has been a member of the League for two years. Originally from Auburn, she and her husband and four year old daughter now reside in Coldwater on a small farm. Katy currently works for Cheaha Brewing Company doing their marketing and distribution, but she also has Cairo Consulting where she trains people on various aspects of Digital Marketing (Google Analytics, Adwords, Social Media, SEO, Adobe products, etc.) and does graphic design work. She teaches Yoga at Evolution Health and Fitness in addition to playing in a folk rock band The Gypsy Begonias. Needless to say Katy wears a lot of hats. She says her daughter has been the biggest inspiration for her in her career. In addition to her current work, Katy is also a US veteran. From that experience Katy suffers from PTSD and until she gave birth to her daughter she really didn't take control of her recovery like she should have. "I stayed at home and keep mostly to myself letting my fears and guilt control me." She took control of her disability and began aggressive therapy through the Veteran's Administration in Birmingham. Katy still struggles with PTSD, anxiety, and depression and some days it wins, but with the love and support of her family, she doesn't let the daily struggles define her. She keep reaching higher and redefining what she sees for her life.

In addition to the Junior League, Katy is also involved in the Northeast Alabama Bicycling Association, Dancing with our Stars (Anniston Rotary), Relay for Life, Calhoun County Chamber of

Commerce, Mainstream Anniston, Anniston Farmer's Market and she volunteers at The Veteran's Administration. She tries to be open and willing to volunteer in any way that benefits our community. In her free time, Katy enjoys yoga, mountain biking, running, cooking, gardening, volunteering, playing music, painting, writing poetry, reading books, acting, singing, hiking, traveling, and entertaining friends and family.

Katy got involved in the League because she really wanted to make more women friends in the community. Since she is not from here, it took a long time for her to find a place in the community. She finds it hard sometimes to make friends with other women, and knew that joining the League would give her the opportunity to not only meet and make new friends, but also give back to the community in ways she had not thought of before. Katy is currently serving her first placement on the Treasury Committee and says it is her favorite so far. She also really enjoys the summer socials. "It is fun meeting all the new ladies and being able to socialize with current members. It is exciting to see everyone so passionate about joining Junior League." About her League experience Katy says, "I have learned that despite the differences I may have, friendships can reach across any barrier in life. There is always someone willing to give a hand if you offer yours first. I have learned that the League is somewhere I can go to find support and inspiration without judgement."

# Sustaining Member—Becky Hollingsworth

Becky has been a member of the League for 28 years. She and her husband currently reside in Anniston. They have two daughters, Rebecca and Mary. Rebecca has two sons (2 & 4 years old) who live in North Carolina so Becky keeps the road hot, trying to visit as much as possible. Becky claims herself to be a professional volunteer and she loves it! She has worked with many groups she enjoys and has made many friends along the way. Currently Becky is the president of Calhoun County Habitat for Humanity. "Our League actually provided the local HFH with the start up funds they needed to become an affiliate. That was over 20 years ago." She is also involved in several things at her church (FUMC-Anniston), and participates with Meals on Wheels. In her free time she enjoys staying busy with tennis, old lady bike riding, sewing on occasion, and cooking and having friends over. "Our favorite restaurant is 'Becky's Kitchen' located at our house. We rarely go out and I love to cook." Becky also enjoys reading in her spare time and her book reading has revolved around the 30+ Reader Digest Condensed Books that her Mother had. "She was an avid reader and when she died I took only some of the books she had. I want to read all of these before I move on to anything else."

Becky was initially interested in Junior League because she wanted to be involved with other women in the community who wanted to make a difference. She has made many friends through her involvement with the League that she would probably never have known otherwise and has remained friends with many of them.



Her placement was mostly served on the Board, but one of her favorite community projects was the Coosa Valley Youth Services graduations. "They always had an inspirational and motivational speaker that you hoped made a connection with the boys who were graduating from the 12 week program. It was possibly their last chance before going to jail if they messed up again. We did all the refreshments and decorated a table and served the families. Making it a special day and hopefully making the boys feel special in knowing that there are people out there that care about them." Through her experience in the League Becky says that "We can all do our own thing and make a difference individually but as a group of women the Junior League can do things that we can not accomplish on our own."
